EYFS Classroom Layouts	Classroom layouts do not allow for social distancing to be adhered to and therefore increase the risk of the spread of infection. In Reception, children will be allocated a table, area in which they can access the provision. They will be encouraged to remain in their groups at all times when carrying out activities. In Pre-School, markers will be placed around the room to identify areas where the children can access. These will be placed at least 1m+ apart and will support the younger children maintaining the social distancing guidelines whilst still accessing continuous provision. In Toddlers, the children will interact with only the other children in their bubble and not have access to other bubbles. This is due to their age and level of understanding. All areas have been remodelled. In Reception, we have added more chairs and desks to support group activities and social distancing, removing some of the larger furniture into storage, allowing more room. Nursery furniture has been removed to create a space to pod activities to support social distancing. Storage shelves and book cases have been emptied and replaced with allocated resources for individual bubbles. These are limited and specifically chosen. All immersive resources, soft furnishings, fabrics and materials have been removed. All fabric seating has been removed. Children not to sit on the carpet at any time. A cleaner will ensure that eating areas are cleaned thoroughly after lunch. Children to come to school in uniforms. Parents will be advised on the importance of washing the school uniforms regularly and how the germ can last on clothing for 72 hours. Where possible children need a fresh set of uniform on daily. Some children in Nursery and Toddlers will wear their own clothes. Children to bring a coat to school that will be placed on a coat peg. Children will go one by one to collect coats at the end of the day. Staff need to wear comfortable clothing that is smart with no jeans allowed, in line with the school policy.
