The current layout and set up do not allow for social distancing to be adhered to and therefore increase the risk of the spread of infection. We have changed the location to enable there to be more physical floor space and it has been remodelled, with chairs and desks in place to allow for social distancing to be maintained. All immersive resources, soft furnishings, fabrics and materials have been removed. Cloakrooms not to be is use during the duration. Children to place coat on allocated chair back. Windows need to be open at all times where possible to aid ventilation. Appropriate supervision is in place. All additional furniture, stage and spare chairs to be moved to the corner of the hall to prevent usage. Clear signage to be displayed in the school hall promoting social distancing. Equipment and shared resources.	Children using the same resources that could pass on the virus.	Pupils	 Children will all have their own personal resources which will remain within their allocated space within their allocated room i.e stationary. Children in the Extended Services Provision will have sets of resources that belong to each bubble. These resources will be sterilised at the end of each day. These resources will not include any soft toys or fabrics, intricate toys or toys which could potentially trap the virus. Where possible children will not take resources to and from school. However, IPADs will go home on a daily basis. On entry to Breakfast club and Afterschool club, these will be disinfected and wiped down and this will be repeated. Children will not share devices and are only permitted to use their own devices. Children may have brought packed lunch boxes from home along with reading books. These will remain with the child for the duration of the session, ensuring they do not come into contact with others. Each 'bubble' will have a range of books to choose from each week. These books will be distributed amongst the children within the bubble. At the end of the week, all books will be placed in a box and will remain there for 7 days before being re-used. Pupils will be encouraged to wash their hands for 20 seconds before and after any food consumption and where possible the use of disposable cutlery and packaging will be used to prevent the spread. Breakfast Club will drop off at 7.45am only at the car park entrance gate After School Club will collect at 5.20pm only at the car park entrance gate. The use of available entrances and exits are maximised. Using all external gate entrances. 1 adult only to drop off and collect children to reduce amount of people congregating— parents have been informed of this. No parents are allowed on school site — with social distancing guidelines being reinforced at entrances and exits through signage and floor/ground marking, including external drop off and pick up points. Staff will collect children from the front of the school gate and walk to and from the hall, entering through external doors. 			 maintaining social distancing. Weekly reminders to parents on the importance of adhering to social distancing measures at the arrival and departure times. Supervision of social distancing on arrival led by members of SLT to ensure parents are adhering to the measures. 				
Children entering school who may have signs/symptoms of Covid 19	Children enter school with signs/symptoms and pass on the virus.		 A table will be set up at the main gate to ensure each child anti-bacs their hands on arrival. Children displaying any signs/symptoms will be sent home immediately and asked self isolate for 7 days and to go and have a COVID test. If the test is negative they are able to return to school when they feel well to do so. If the test is positive they will be told to self-isolate for 14 days along with any member of their household. Children who present signs whilst in school will be taken to the Oasis room and quarantined there till collection. The child will then be asked to again go and take a Covid 19 test. If positive they will be asked to self-isolate for 14 days along with any member of their household and the children and staff within the 'bubble' they are in. If found to be negative, the child may return to school once well enough to do so. Staff must wear full PPE whilst supporting the child along with a visor. Pupils are encouraged to access the toilet throughout the provision to avoid queues. The toilets are cleaned frequently at different points throughout the day, prior to the extended services provision and afterwards. Monitoring by cleaning staff to ensure a constant supply of soap and paper towels are available. Bins are emptied regularly. Pupils are reminded regularly how to wash hands and young children are supervised in doing so. Posters are displayed and rhymes are taught to support children in the handwashing process. Children to come to school in uniforms. Parents will be advised on the importance of washing the school uniforms regularly and how the germ can last on clothing for 72 hours. Where possible children need a fresh set of uniform on daily. Children to bring a coat to school that has to be placed on the back of their chairs whilst in Extended Service provision. No cloakroom facilities to be used. Staff need to ensure they wash their clothes at the end of every day and have shower when they get home. The Reception Area is closed to all pupils and parents on a daily basis. Parents are advised to ring school or contact through Facebook with any concerns or issues they may have. Parents are asked to pay all fees through the online payment system or through childcare vouchers. Anti-bac gel and spray will be provided on the main desk. A glass screen in in place to protect the Receptionist with guidance of social distancing and controlling the spread of infection measures clearly displayed. If a parent is insistent on wanting to speak to a member of staff, an appointment will be made and arrangement to ensure that all parties adhere to social distancing measures when entering the site. Cleaning	Areas are not cleaned regularly enough leading to the spread of infection. Areas around school have been restricted to prevent the spread of infection. Consistent cleaning and wiping down of surfaces, door handles, tables, switches, resources – basically anything the children are touching, regularly throughout the day. There is anti-bacterial spray and towel on a roll provided. Bins to be emptied at regular intervals, if they are getting full throughout the day.
