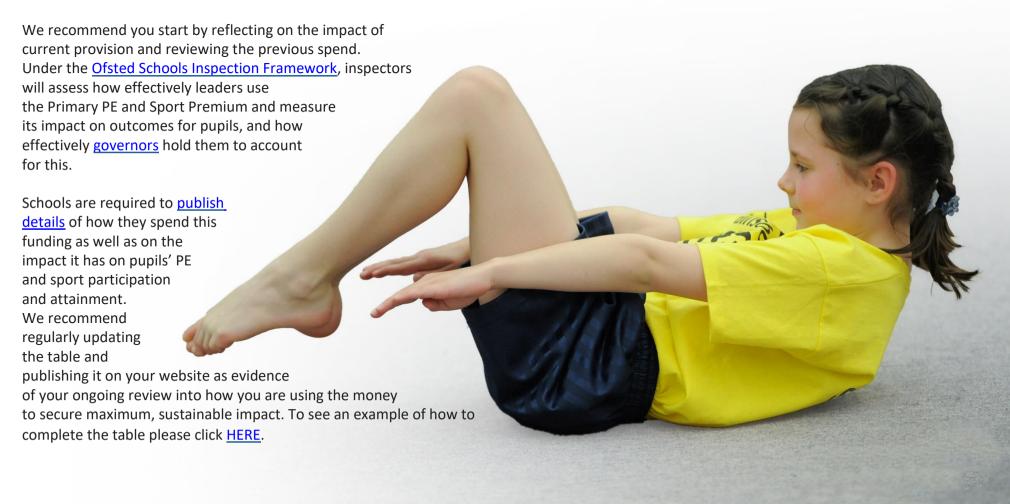




Schools must use the funding to make **additional and sustainable** improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This means that you should use the Primary PE and Sport Premium to:
