The Vikings

Year 3 Summer Term

We Are Learning About ...

Maths:

During the Summer term, Year Three will be looking at fractions in depth and will be learning how to compare, order and add fractions confidently. Children will also continue to look at working with time such as learning how many minutes there are in an hour and hours within a day etc...



English:

Within our English lessons this term, children will be studying a variety of different genres of text. The two themed units that the children will be called 'How Does Your Garden Grow' and 'What the Romans Did for Us'. These two units will give children opportunities to read and write playscripts, write non-chronological reports, write their own fantasy story and also look at some more examples of classic poetry.

Science:

The Science topics this term are Light and Forces and Magnets.

We will focus on how we see things and how shadows are formed. We will also look at the force of friction and how magnets attract and repel.

Geography/History:

In History and Geography, we will be looking at key events from the Viking times and their effect on Britain today. We will also find out about Europe and Scandinavia. In addition to this, we will spend time learning about coastlines in Britain and in Scandinavia and their differing features.

Art/Design Technology:

For Art and Design Technology this term, we will be looking at Painting with watercolours. We will be using a view-finder. Within our DT lessons, we will design and make a structure with a Mechanism.



We will theme our work based on the Vikings and our current learning.

Computing:

In computing, we will start to learn about emails and communication and how these are used effectively. We will also learn to create forms online to analyse data and how to read what different forms are showing us.

PSHE:

Throughout the Summer term, we will be looking at Valuing Differences, Keeping Safe and Money. We will learn about different risks and think about keeping ourselves safe within a variety of different situations. We will also spend some time building on our previously taught knowledge of money and how we are able to save up to buy things in the future.

French:

In French during the Summer term, we will improve our French vocabulary learning about the days of the week and the different months of the year. We will do this both verbally and within writing too.

Music:

In music, we will be looking at our new unit of work; Bringing Us Together. During this topic, we will continue to look at how we are able to understand the values of different musical notation. We will then look at being able to use this notation to compose our own music to play on the glockenspiel.

PE:

During the Summer term in Year Three, children will be looking at a number of different sporting games and the skills required to play these games. Children will also revisit the skills required to play and work together as a team ready for our school Sports Day.

RE:

In RE, we will be finding out about Sikhism and Hinduism. We will focus on family in the Hinduism belief and why family is so important within the religion.

Then children will look at discovering what a Guru is in Sikhism and the importance of all Guru's within the religion of Sikhism.
