OLYMPIA Ancient Greece

Geography/History:

During our Topic this term, we will be looking at Ancient Greece. We will find out about the different beliefs in this important time within history. We will also use maps to identify mountains and seas in this area of Europe. We will also spend some time looking at being able to name and locate the worlds different oceans, countries and continents.

Art/Design Technology:

In Art this term, we will look at drawing people who are moving and the different techniques required to help us do this effectively. We are also going to make our own pop-up books about a given theme. In DT, we are going to make salt dough and use the shapes created by us to make Ancient Greek style jewellery.

PSHE:

In PSHE we will be thinking about how important it is to communicate well. We will also be learning how to be independent and take responsibility for our actions. Towards the end of the term, we will also talk about sensible spending.



Maths:

This term in Maths, we will spend time looking at being able to work with decimal numbers. The children will look at being able to add, subtract, multiply and divide decimals. Children will also spend time working on developing their knowledge of being able to measure and draw angles using protractors. Towards the end of the term, children will also work on being able to convert between different units of measure.

English:

During Summer term, children will spend time looking studying a range of different texts and will also look at the different structures and features of different text types. These will include: myths, non-chronological reports, figurative poems, stories from other cultures and also persuasive debates. Children will also attempt to write their own versions of these texts around a given theme.

Science:

The Science topic this term is Animals including Humans. During this topic we will focus on the development of humans from birth to old age, thinking about different natural changes during each of the stages of human life.

Music:

In Music we will be continuing to develop our understanding and knowledge of the musical staff and where each of the musical notes sit upon this. Children will also begin to compose music in writing.

Computing:

Within our Computing lessons, we are going to learn to develop and program a game using online software. We are also going to learn how to use and access websites online safely.

PE:

Our PE topics for the Summer term are athletics and striking and fielding games. We will look at different athletics events and focus on cricket in our games sessions.

<u>RE</u>

In RE we will focus on Buddhism and Christianity. In Buddhism we will learn about 'Contentment' in the religion and within Christianity we will learn all about the holy trinity.
