<p>In 2023-2024, we used sports premium money to work with different companies to provide additional sporting clubs over the lunchtime period. Fylde Rugby club came into school and whilst working with children through the Rugby Reading program, they also carried out an additional Rugby lesson over the lunch period for children in KS1 and KS2. Blackpool Football club came into school and worked with the children on their Fitness and fit2go programmes. We also carried out football sessions for children in Key Stage 2.</p>

In the academic year 2023-2024, 29 children in Year 5 accessed Bike ability and completed a 2-day training course looking at the Bike ability program levels 1 and 2. All children were given the opportunity to learn to either ride a bike or use a bike safely when riding on the road. School supported the hiring of bikes and helmets and ensured each child had the correct equipment which allowed them to participate.				
To support the younger children in EYFS with learning to ride a bike by looking at the Bikeability, Balance Bike programmes.	Children will participate in sessions to develop their balance and co-ordination when riding a 2-wheeler bike.	£500	Children across EYFS will be more confident in the skills needed to ride a bike. Younger children will be able to balance and co-ordinate whilst older children can ride independently.	3%
In the academic year 2023-2024, The EYFS introduced their own version of the 'Learn to Ride a Bike' program across Toddlers and Pre-School. Initially working with scooters and balance bikes, staff worked in sessions with small groups to improve their balance and co-ordination skills before transferring to a two-wheeler bike. This is something that is on-going and will continue to be enhanced going forward.

<p><b>Evaluation:</b> School leased a mini-bus for the academic year 2023-2024. This was invaluable and supported children to attend a range of Sporting events across Blackpool and the Fylde. The children took part in Outdoor Adventurous activities, Cross-Country Running events, Youth Games, Orienteering, Dance festivals, Fit2Go, Fit2Glow and a range of inter schools sporting events at no additional costs to parents and families. This was open to all children across Key Stage 1 and 2. It allowed us to access facilities at the local sixth form colleges, the main sports centre at Stanley Park and the local sports centre at Moor Park. As a result, not only did this increase the children's participation in competitive sports, it allowed us to successfully aim and achieve Schools Games Mark Gold in recognition for our participation. This is something Kincraig has not previously been able to achieve. Due to the success of this in 2023-2024, the school will look to lease two minibuses in the academic year 2024-2025, to allow more classes and larger groups of children access at the same time.</p>
